We are delighted to say that following further investment last year the PM reading scheme is up and running in many of our classes. The boys are enjoying the wide range of fiction and nonfiction titles available to them and guided reading will now begin in Senior Infants in the coming term. The PM series is an Australian guided reading programme. Evidence based research has shown that the use of PM readers helps to establish fundamental skills necessary for proficient reading. It also helps to identify weaknesses and strengthen specific skills. Following a period of guided reading in school and at home children begin to build reading fluency, improve attention to detail and expand vocabulary knowledge. It also supports reading comprehension strategies. Further information and details of the programme will be sent to relevant classes shortly. Due to the significant cost of these books, it is essential that great care is taken to ensure that they are not lost or damaged.

- Always ask for permission before going online and downloading apps or games
- Beware of scams If you are unsure of any links or emails don't open them.



Please be reminded that as per our Acceptable Use Policy, the use of any SMART device or recording device (video or audio) is forbidden in school. If a pupil is found to be using such a device in school, it will be confiscated and a parent/guardian must collect it from the school office. # **STAY SAFE PROGRAMME**

Stay Safe lessons will begin in all classes this month. The Stay Safe Programme is a personal safety skills programme for primary schools. Its overall objective is to prevent child abuse, bullying and other forms of victimisation.

The programme develops children's ability to recognise, resist and report risk situations or abusive encounters by teaching children...

- To identify for themselves unsafe or upsetting situations
- Simple rules to help them avoid abuse
- To respect and value the rights of others
- The language and skills they require to seek help.

Worksheets to accompany the lessons may be given as homework to your child or may be brought home for you to sign. It's important that you use these to discuss the content of the lesson with your child. ## SCHOOLSELF-EVALUATION



Each school is obliged to engage in **School Self-Evaluation.** This is a process which encourages reflection on what are doing well, new initiatives or developments in education and what we want prioritise to work on next in relation to our specific school context.

As a staff we collaborated and looked at areas of teaching and learning in our school which are strong and areas in which we would like to develop further. We have decided that the focus of our School Self-Evaluation for this cycle is **Digital Literacy- using digital technology to enhance language and learning outcomes.** 

We have engaged with Oide (professional development service for teaching and learning) to develop a **Digital Learning Strategy** for 2023-2026.

As part of this strategy we have;

•Created a **Digital Literacy Team** who will support staff in adopting new technologies and liaise with outside agencies in relation to procurement and support.

•Developed a **Digital Learning Plan** where we have identified a progressive and sequential approach to developing key competencies and skills in relation to digital literacy, with a focus on enhancing language and learning outcomes for our pupils.

•We have engaged in a comprehensive review of our current IT infrastructure. •We have engaged in the procurement process and ordered 20 new Ipads for pupil use. We have also developed a long- term procurement plan which will depend on funding.

•We are currently engaging in the roll-out phase of adopting and integrating specific digital technology tools which will support and enhance literacy and language learning and outcomes.

We will be consistently reviewing teaching and learning in relation to digital technology in order to ensure we are providing the best possible learning experiences and opportunities to our pupils in relation to digital literacy and digital technology. We are very excited about this opportunity and look forward to updating you in due course.
