# Seachtain na Gaeilge

Is féile idirnáisiúnta Ghaeilge í Seachtain na Gaeilge, atá ar an gceiliúradh is mó dár dteanga agus dár gcultúr dúchais a bhíonn ar siúl in Éirinn agus i go leor tíortha eile gach bliain.

Cinnte bíonn a lán spraoi agus Gaeilge le cloistéail i Scoil Naomh Bhríde i rith Seachtain na Gaeilge.

Is iomaí na himeachtaí Gaelacha a bhíonn á reáchtáil againn sa scoil. Gach rud ó Raidió Naomh Bríd agus Comórtas Ealaíne go Tráth na gCeist, ó Siúlóid Dúlra agus Céilí go Lá Glas. Déanann na daltaí sár iarracht Gaeilge a labhairt agus táimid go léir an-bhródúil astu.

Tá súil againn go bhfuil na daltaí go léir ag baint taitneamh as Seachtain na Gaeilge 2024. Bí cinnte go mbaineann tú trial as píosa beag Ghaeilge a labhairt sa bhaile freisin. Mar a deirtear "Is fearr Gaeilge briste ná Béarla cliste".

Seachtain na Gaeilge is an international event in which we celebrate our Irish language and culture, both in Ireand and across the world.

We certainly have a lot of fun celebrating Seachtain na Gaeilge in St. Brigid's and it is amazing hearing all the boys speaking our native language.

There are all types of activities organised in each class. We have everything from Raidió Naomh Bríd and art competitions to table quizzes, from nature walks and Céilí to our very own Green Day. On Friday 15th March the boys may come to school dressed in green! The boys always make an amazing effort to speak in Irish and we are extremely proud of them all.

We hope the boys are enjoying Seachtain na Gaeilge 2024. Give a go speaking a little Irish at home. Don't worry if you make mistakes because as the "seanfhocal" says, "Broken Irish is better than clever English".



# SCHOOL TWINNING PROGRAMME- UGANDA

This year, Lá Glas is in aid of Uganda. We are establishing a School Twinning Programme with Juliana Memorial School for the Deaf in Mityana. Over the coming months, Ms. Sheeran will be consulting with the boys in 4th class to find out what aspects of life in Uganda they would like to learn about. She will also develop a photo pack on St. Brigid's to bring over there in July. Juliana is a primary school which also provides vocational training. It is a mixed boarding school with an enrolment of 97 students, ranging in age from 4 to 20 years.

Ms. Sheeran has spent a lot of time working in Juliana over the years and will be returning there to work for the summer. She will develop a photo pack on Juliana to bring back to St. Brigid's and will consult with students there on what they would like to learn about Ireland.

The students, from both schools, will begin to exchange letters, cards, photos and stories in September. Money raised through Lá Glas will pay for the resources and postage required by both schools. Any additional funds will be spent on books for Juliana. At present, they only have text books but nothing for the children to read for pleasure. We are hoping to change that and to introduce paired reading into the school. Thank you in advance for you support of this project.

At SCIENCE BLAST, the boys presented their work to judges and pupils from many other schools.


The quality of the investigations from our boys was excellent, with extremely positive feedback given by the judges.
