
MATHS WEEK

The Student Council have some great ideas and plans and we look forward to working with them throughout the year.


Attendance and Punctuality

The school continues to be obliged by law to inform
Tusla when a pupil is absent for a total of 20 school
days in one school year. Parents will receive a letter
of reminder when 18 days have been missed.
Obviously, the whole idea is to miss as little as
possible. As we have to fill in the category of
absence when informing Tusla it is essential that
each absence is explained.

This year as our plan for our Green Schools initiative is to revisit the Green Schools themes of 1. Litter and Waste, 2. Energy and 3. Water.

This will enable us to consolidate our practice and routines in these areas as a school.

The messages, ideas and school guidelines relating to these themes will be communicated to our pupils at assemblies and through our Green School Committee and Student Council representatives.

In relation to our first theme of Litter and Waste, we would like to share the following message regarding School Lunches:

- After eating their lunch, pupils should keep their rubbish in their lunch box and bring it home.
- Pupils must drink milk cartons in school and any remaining milk in cartons can be emptied at the sink and carton flattened. These are then returned to their lunch boxes and brought home.
- Full milk cartons cannot be sent home in bags.
